Hoffmans book, like Sylvia Nasars biography of John Nash, A Beautiful Mind, reveals a geniuss life that transcended the merely quirky. But Erdoss brand of madness was joyful, unlike Nashs despairing schizophrenia. Erdos never tried to dilute his obsessive passion for numbers with ordinary emotional interactions, thus avoiding hurting the people around him, as Nash did. Oliver Sacks writes of Erdos: A mathematical genius of the first order, Paul Erdos was totally obsessed with his subject--he thought and wrote mathematics for nineteen hours a day until the day he died. He traveled constantly, living out of a plastic bag, and had no interest in...
